



San Diego River Bike Lane Entryway into Ocean Beach

This is in reference to the heavily used pathway on the southside of the San Diego River from Sunset Cliffs bridge, heading west.

This section of pathway is a high priority for repairs and resurfacing. The potholes and lack of surface are clearly a safety concern.

The worst section is approximate three hundred yards long, which runs from Sunset Cliffs Bridge to the west.

This pathway runs along and in front of the skate park. This is not to say that the whole path from the bridge all the way to the beach should not be upgraded, because it should. This is merely to point out that a large section is in need of immediate attention. The lack of infrastructure maintenance over the decades has caught up with this Path.



The pathway is the entrance to Ocean Beach. Used by walkers, joggers, scooters and cyclists into and out of Robb field. Additionally, this is also the primary connection from the pathway through Robb Field onto the Bicycle Boulevard, Bacon Street.

Hotels such as the Hyatt and the Dana have bikes and scooters for tourists. These same folks take advantage of our business district. This section of pathway is heavily used year round. Perhaps a funding source such as the transit occupancy tax (TOT) could be utilized. Either way, these safety concerns are paramount.

The Transportation Board requests repairs to be expedited and made a priority. Safe access to commerce into our lovely beach community should be a safe and smooth experience.
